Learned senior counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioners states that the benefit of re-fixation of the pay as being prayed in the present writ petition has already been extended to the petitioners during the pendency of the writ petition. The benefit, which remains, as per the petitioners, is the arrears of pension which the petitioners become entitled for upon the said re-fixation.

Learned senior counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioners states that for the said relief, liberty be granted to the petitioners to file appropriate representation with the respondents claiming the same by giving the details of their claim and the respondents be directed to decide the said claim in a time bound manner.

Learned counsel for the respondents admits that in case any representation is received from the petitioners claiming the benefit of arrears of pension, the same will be considered in accordance with law and appropriate orders will be passed within a period of three months from the date of receipt of said representation.

Learned counsel for the petitioners states that keeping in view the statement given by learned counsel for the respondents, the present writ petition may be disposed of having been not pressed any further.

In view of the above, the present writ petition is disposed of having been not pressed.
