JITENDRA CHAUHAN, J.

This writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India has been filed for issuance of direction to the respondents to revise the pay scales of the petitioners w.e.f. 1.11.1971 instead of 16.7.1975 as per the law laid down by this Court in CWP-2208 of 1989 titled as “Lekh Raj Khara and others vs. State of Punjab and another” (Annexure P-8).

Learned counsel for the petitioners states that at this stage, he would be satisfied, if a direction is issued to respondent No. 2- Director of Public Instructions (Sec. Education), Punjab to consider and decide the representation dated 5.7.2009 (Annexure P-9) expeditiously.

Learned State counsel states that she is not averse to the suggestion put forth by the learned counsel for the petitioners.

Heard.

In view of the above, without advertng to the merits of the

case, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No. 2- Director of Public Instructions (Sec. Education), Punjab to consider and decide the representation dated 5.7.2009 (Annexure P-9) in accordance with law within six weeks from the date of receipt of the certified copy of the judgment. In case, on consideration, the competent authority reaches to the conclusion that the benefit claimed by the petitioners is admissible to them, in such eventuality, the consequential relief be allowed to them, within a period of six weeks thereafter. However, in case the competent authority feels that the relief claimed by the petitioners is not admissible or made out, in that case, a speaking order be passed in the matter.
