The applicant/petitioner has moved CM No.14961 of 2019 for withdrawal of the writ petition, as the dispute between the mother-in-law and daughter-in-law has been settled by entering into compromise dated 07.09.2019 (Annex A-1). As per Clause 3 of the settlement (Annex A-1), the mother-in-law has agreed and settled not to dispossess the petitioner (daughter-in-law) from the house; and as per Clause 4 of the settlement, the petitioner has undertaken to withdraw all the litigations instituted and pending against respondent No.2 (mother-in-law). Respondent No.3 is a witness to the settlement.

In view of the settlement, the prayer for withdrawal of the main writ petition is accepted. Consequently, while allowing the instant application, CWP No.20243 of 2017 is ordered to stand dismissed as withdrawn.
