Pursuant to the order of this Court dated 25.07.2019, the report of the learned JMIC, Sunam, dated 25.09.2019, is on record, stating to the effect that the statements of the petitioner, Salim Khan, as also of the complainant in the FIR, i.e Ranjit Kumar, were recorded before that court, to the effect that they have compromised the matter and as per the assessment of the learned Magistrate, the compromise is seen to have been arrived at between the parties without any undue influence, pressure or coercion.

Learned counsel for the petitioner, as also counsel for the complainant, submit that there are no other criminal cases registered against the petitioner, with learned State counsel submitting that she has no instructions in that regard, though as per the statements recorded before the learned Magistrate, it is seen that it was stated to the same effect.

Consequently, looking at the nature of crime alleged to

have been committed by the petitioner, the present petition is allowed. FIR No.153 dated 18.12.2016, registered against the petitioner at Police Station Chhajali, District Sangrur, for the alleged commission of offences punishable under Sections 420 and 406 of the IPC, along with all proceedings emanating therefrom, is hereby quashed.
