Petitioner has sought parole for six weeks for treatment of his wife Kulwant Kaur, who is stated to be suffering from Hepatitis C with Cirrhosis of Liver (Liver failure).

Report of the State was called for. Today status report by way of affidavit of Amandeep Kaur, PPS Deputy Superintendent of Police, Sub Division, Attari, District Amritsar Rural on behalf of respondent no.1 filed in Court is taken on record. It is stated that when ASI Mohinder Singh visited the house of the petitioner along with respectables of the village, Kulwant Kaur wife of the petitioner was not found present in the house. Inder Singh, father of the petitioner informed that Kulwant Kaur has gone to some relations but he does not know when she will come back nor he knows about her mobile number. File bearing date 12.10.2017 was presented before the police prepared at Civil Hospital, Manawala, Amritsar, wherein

no fresh entry regarding treatment of Kulwant Kaur was found.

It being so, ground of serious illness of the wife of the petitioner is found to be incorrect. Therefore, on this ground there is no ground to grant parole. There is no illegality or infirmity in the impugned order dated 9.5.2014 passed by District Magistrate, Amritsar.

Resultantly, the present petition stands dismissed.
