Learned counsel for the respondent-Union of India submits that prayer of the petitioner is rendered infructuous in view of the order dated 16.02.2019 passed by respondent No.2, during the pendency of writ petition, whereby dismissal of the petitioner has been converted into discharge from service. Copy of the same has been handed over to this Court, which is taken on record.

2. The writ petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondents to pass a specific order with regard to the prayer of the petitioner regarding grant of consequential benefits, including pension etc.

3. Let the needful be done within a period of 60 days from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

4. In the event, on favourable order being passed, the petitioner shall be disbursed the amount of consequential benefits, within three months thereafter. Needless to say that the petitioner shall be at liberty to seek appropriate remedy challenging the order qua grant of consequential benefits, in case the same is adverse to his interest.

5. The writ petition stands disposed of in the above said terms.
