This is an application for directing respondent No.4
to coordinate with B.L. Kapoor Hospital, Karol Bagh, New Delhi.

Heard.

The main case is pre-poned with the consent of the
parties and is taken on today's board.

Main case

The prayer made in the present petition is for grant of

interim compensation under various government schemes.

Learned State counsel states that as per the guidelines, an amount of Rs.1 lakh by respondent No.1 and amount of Rs.1 lakh by respondent No.3 and an amount of Rs.1 lakh under the Prime Minister National Relief fund has been released in favour of the victim. A further direction has been issued to Dr. B.L. Kapur Memorial Hospital, Delhi to treat the victim.

This Court on 24.05.2019, had passed the following order:-

“At request, hearing is deferred to 02.07.2019.

The respondents are directed to pay the entire amount under various schemes to the petitioner in the meantime. Let the parents/guardian of the petitioner remain available to the Court on the next date of hearing to decide the future course of treatment. Dr. Nitin Garg, Medical Officer, present in the Court, is directed to send some representative to B.L. Kapoor Hospital, Karol Bagh, New Delhi, to coordinate and ensure that the best available treatment is administered to the petitioner and apprise the hospital authorities that the State will bear the entire charges so that the hospital authorities do not insist on day-to-day payment with regard to the treatment of the petitioner. A copy of the order be given to learned State counsel under signatures of the Bench Secretary.”

In pursuance to the order passed by this Court, the State has received a communication dated 26.06.2009 from Dr. B.L. Kapoor Memorial Hospital, which is taken on record as Mark-A, whereby prayer of the petitioner for treating the victim has been acceded to on the assurance that the

amount paid shall be reimbursed by the State.

Learned State counsel, on instructions, states that the entire amount towards treatment of the victim already stands reimbursed. The requisite remaining payment towards treatment of the victim shall be reimbursed by the State within 30 days of the submission of the bill/invoice.

In view of above, the Court feels that the intended purpose of filing the present petition is fully achieved and no further orders at this stage are required to be passed in the present petition.

Disposed of accordingly.
