This is 2nd petition for grant of anticipatory bail in FIR No.290 dated 16.10.2018 under Sections 186, 332, 353, 379 IPC, registered at Police Station Pinjore, District Panchkula, earlier one was disposed of, to approach the Sessions Court.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that as per allegations in the FIR, the petitioner, along with one Baljit Singh, was found in a car bearing registration No.CH-01V-4182 and on checking, 11 pieces of khair wood were found. It is further case of the complainant that on seeing the complainant party, the petitioner and other accused, after giving beating to the complainant, ran away from the spot. It is further submitted that value of the wood is not more than Rs.25,000/- and the petitioner is not registered owner of the car and he has

been falsely implicated.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Savinder Singh, submits that registered owner of the car is one Stanley Joseph, who is not traceable and has not disputed that value of the wood is approximately Rs.25,000/-.

In reply, learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner is ready to deposit an amount of Rs.25,000/- with the trial Court and the trial Court may be directed to keep the said amount in the shape of FDR subject to final outcome of the case.

In view of the above, this petition is disposed of and the petitioner is granted anticipatory bail subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.

However, it will be open for the Investigating Officer to call the petitioner by giving him a notice in writing.

The petitioner is granted 30 days' time to deposit the aforesaid amount of Rs.25,000/- with the trial Court/Illaq Magistrate, which will be kept in the shape of FDR subject to final outcome of the case.
