INDERJIT SINGH, J.

Petitioner has filed this second petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in a case FIR No.182 dated 27.10.2017, registered at Police Station Ajnala, District Amritsar, under Sections 302, 148, 323 and 324 read with Section 149 of the IPC and Section 25 of the Arms Act, 1959.

Notice of motion was issued. Learned State counsel has appeared on behalf of the respondent-State and complainant also appeared through his counsel. They contested this petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that the present petitioner is named in the FIR. He is stated to be armed with *datar* and has given injury to the deceased on his head above the left ear.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; in view of the nature and gravity of the offence and in view of the facts that the petitioner has taken active participation in the commission of offence and caused injury to the deceased and there is every chance of tampering with the evidence, if he is released on bail, I do not find it a fit case where the petitioner is entitled to the benefit of regular bail.

Therefore, finding no merit in the present petition, the same is dismissed.
