The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No. 37 dated 28.02.2019, under Sections 147, 148, 149, 323, 365, 379-B and 506 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station Loharu, District Bhiwani.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that there is a delay of eight days in registering the FIR wherein it is alleged that the petitioner along with nine other accused had snatched a sum of Rs.1,200/- from the complainant and caused him injuries. However, there is no MLR of the injured and the petitioner is not involved in any other case.

This Court, by the order dated 29.08.2019, had directed the petitioner to appear before the Investigating/Arresting Officer and join the investigation and in the event of his arrest, he was to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, upon instructions from ASI Dharambir Singh, states that the petitioner has joined investigation and is not required for custodial interrogation.

In view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner and the petitioner having joined investigation and not required for custodial interrogation, the order dated 29.08.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. He shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
