Main cases

By this order we will dispose of five writ petitions bearing

The facts are taken from CWP no. 22482 of 2018.

The petitioner has filed this writ petition with a prayer that circulars issued by the Union of India prescribing NEET as the basis for admission to BAMS course is unsustainable.

We had on 26.10.2018 passed a detailed order permitting the admission of the students without insistence on NEET eligibility. Before we would conclude this matter in the present writ petition, the Hon'ble Supreme Court has passed an order in case titled as 'Association of Managements of Homeopathic Medical Colleges of Maharashtra vs. Union of India and others' bearing Civil Appeal no. 1393 of 2019 decided on 1.2.2019 and in view of it, no further orders are required to be passed in the present writ petitions and the same are disposed of as such.

CM No. 17183-CWP-2018 in CWP No.22482 of 2018

Learned counsel for the applicant has explained the lapse in filing the reply belatedly. Taking into consideration the explanation, we deem it appropriate to reduce the costs from Rs.50,000/- to Rs.20,000/- imposed vide orders dated 26.10.2018. The costs, if not already deposited, be deposited before the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court within a period of two weeks from today.
