(1) The present writ petition has been filed by the petitioner – a minor, with a prayer *inter alia* seeking a direction to the respondent to correct the name of the minor child (the petitioner) as Arshit Kumar Sarao s/o Sanjeev Kumar Sarao.

(2) Learned counsel who puts in appearance for the respondent- CBSE submits that in **CWP No.18246 of 2017 (Tushar Mangal vs. Central Board of Secondary Education & Ors.)** decided on 04.10.2018, this Court had directed the writ petitioner therein to file an affidavit that the difference in two names may be just inadvertent but both are one and the same person. It was also directed to file an affidavit that the petitioner will not claim any relief under criminal/civil proceedings, if any, on the basis of corrected matriculation certificate in respect of changed father's name.

(3) Learned counsel submits that the petitioner would file an affidavit in terms of the order passed by this Court in **Tushar Mangla's** case (supra).

(4) Accordingly, the present writ petition is disposed of with the

- (i) The petitioner may file an affidavit within one week before the respondent in terms of the order passed by this Court on 04.10.2018 in **Tushar Mangla's** case (supra);
- (ii) The respondent is directed to consider the affidavit and make necessary correction in their record and issue fresh certificates to the petitioner after incorporating the corrected names within two weeks from the date the affidavit is submitted;
- (iii) The authorities will also follow the further directions in the order dated 04.10.2018 and ensure compliance within two weeks from the date the affidavit is filed.
- (5) The writ petition thus stands disposed of in above terms.
