Petitioner-Hardeep Singh @ Sandhi has filed the present petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail pending trial in case FIR No.26 dated 18.2.2019, under Sections 302, 323, 325, 148, 149 IPC, registered at Police Station Goindwal Sahib, District Tarn Taran. The petitioner is in custody since his arrest on 10.3.2019.

As per FIR, on 08.2.2019, at about 3 pm, when the complainant Gurpreet Singh was coming back to his house, accused Satnam Singh @ Sattu struck his motor-cycle into his motor-cycle from behind and after spoken filthy language to him, he went to his house. At about 7 p.m. when the complainant was standing at the main gate of the house, then accused

Satnam Singh @ Sattu armed with Dattar alongwith Nishan Singh @ Vicky armed with baseball bat, Sukhchain Singh @ Chena armed with Gandasi, Sarabjit Singh armed with daang and Hardeep Singh @ Sandhi armed with dang came out of the house of accused Satnam Singh and on seeing the complainant, accused Satnam gave datar blow from reverse side, which hit on the ankle of right leg of complainant. Accused Sarabjit Singh gave daang blow, which hit on the upper side of his left knee. Then after raising noise, mother of complainant, namely, Jagir Kaur and father Labh Singh came to rescue him. Thereafter accused Nishan Singh @ Vicky gave a baseball blow to his father Labh Singh, which hit on the backside of his head, resultantly, his father fell down on the same place and became unconscious. Accused Hardeep Singh @ Sandhi (petitioner) caused a daang blow to Jagir Kaur, which hit on the backside of her head. Accused Satnam Singh also inflicted daang blow to Jagir Kaur, which hit on the elbow of her left arm. Thereafter, on raising alarm, many people were gathered at the spot and all the assailants ran away alongwith their respective weapons.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the alleged occurrence took place on 08.2.2019, wherein father of the complainant, namely, Labh Singh (deceased) suffered injuries. The victim was got admitted in hospital and was discharged after treatment on 16.2.2019. According to him the victim was again hospitalised on 17.2.2019 and thereafter on the next day i.e. on 18.2.2019 the FIR was registered under Sections 323, 325, 148, 149 IPC. It was on the death of Labh Singh on

26.2.2019, offence punishable under Section 302 IPC was added. Learned counsel further contends that the petitioner is alleged to have caused simple injuries to the wife of deceased, namely, Jagir Kaur.

On the other hand, learned State counsel, who is assisted by ASI Sawaran Singh opposed the prayer. However, he does not dispute this fact that the FIR was lodged on 18.2.2019. He submits that the charges are yet to be framed and total 19 witnesses are to be examined by the prosecution.

After hearing learned counsel for the parties, this Court finds that the trial of the case is likely to consume considerable time and keeping in view the custodial period of the petitioner, his further custody may not be justified. Therefore, without meaning any expression of opinion on the merits of the case, it is ordered that the petitioner be released on regular bail subject to his furnishing requisite bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court, Tarn Taran.

The petition is allowed.
