This writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India has been filed for the issuance of a writ, in the nature of certiorari for quashing the impugned orders dated 30.05.2018, 16.07.2018 and 03.08.2018 (Annexure P-14 (Colly) passed by respondent No.3-Punjab State Commission for NRIs, Block-A, through its Registrar Secretary, Punjab Civil Secretariat-2, Sector-9, Chandigarh (in shor 'NRI Commission').

A short reply by way of affidavit has been filed on behalf of respondent Nos.4 & 5 in the Court today, same is taken on record. Copy thereof has been supplied to the learned counsel opposite.

Learned counsel for respondent No.6 states that vide interim order dated 03.08.2018 (Annexure P-14) a recommendation was made to the State of Punjab by the NRI Commission not to proceed further to file challan in the Court.

Vide order dated 28.09.2018 (Annexure R-6/2), NRI Commission has concluded the proceedings and all the impugned orders have merged into the final order dated 28.09.2018.

In this view of the matter, the present petition has been rendered infructuous. The aggrieved party may assail the final order (Annexure R6/2) passed by the NRI Commission, if so advised.
