This order shall dispose of CRM-M-35311-2019, filed by petitioner-Rajan Sharma and CRM-M-38385-2019, filed by petitioner-Jashandeep Singh @ Jashanpreet Singh @ Billa, under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.181 dated 30.07.2019, registered at Police Station Police Commissionerate, Islamabad, Amritsar under Sections 307, 427, 506, 34 of the Indian Penal Code and Sections 25 and 27 of the Arms Act, 1959.

Notice of motion was issued in both these petitions.

Learned State counsel put in appearance on behalf of the respondent-State and contested these petitions.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioners as well as learned State counsel and have gone through the record.

From the record, I find that only *lalkara* has been attributed to

the present petitioners and there is no injury attributed to them. The injury with firearm weapon is stated to be on the thumb of the injured/complainant.

In pursuance of the interim orders dated 28.08.2019 and 10.09.2019 passed by this Court, the petitioners have already joined the investigation. They are not required for custodial interrogation. Therefore, no useful purpose will be served by sending them to custody.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts of the case in minute details and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, I find merit in both these petitions and the same are allowed. The orders dated 28.08.2019 and 10.09.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioners, are made absolute. However, the petitioners shall join the investigation as and when called upon to do so and shall abide by the conditions of Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.
