Pursuant to the order dated 12.09.2019, the affidavit of Sh. Jagmohan Singh, Deputy Commissioner of Police, Law & Order, Amritsar (City), has been filed in Court today by learned State counsel, giving therein the details of the date on which the petitioners' house was visited/raided by Head Constables Nishan Singh and Palwinder Singh, with the petitioner not found there; but with, on one occasion, his mother, Simarjit Kaur, found to be present, who is stated to have

been duly informed of the fact of the warrants having been issued, with her statement recorded on the back of the warrant, and her thumb impression also stated to have been taken.

Further, it has been stated that on notices issued to the surety of the petitioner, i.e. one Swaran Kaur, at house no. 55, Abadi Deshmesh Avenue, Naushera, Amritsar, the address itself was “not traced”.

Thereafter, Head Constable Nishan Singh is stated to have gone to the house of the petitioner where the petitioners' mother was asked about Swaran Kaur, with her telling the police official that she (Swaran Kaur) was the petitioners' mother-in-law, who is living somewhere in Uttar Pradesh, and that she had suffered a heart attack, but with her address not disclosed.

That being so, I see no reason to entertain these petitions, which are consequently dismissed, with no comment made on the merits of the case.
