Report dated 21.11.2019 of the learned Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Batala has been received whereby after recording statements of respondent No.2-Nitika Marwaha and accused/petitioners, namely, Neeraj Bhalla, Manju Bhalla and Nikhil Bhalla, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of their own free will, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court and the fact that the dispute between the parties being a pure matrimonial and the offence for which the accused have been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another**' 2012 (4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.227 dated 12.12.2018 registered at Police Station City Batala, District Gurdaspur under Sections 498-A, 406, 506, 34 of the IPC and all consequences arising out of the said FIR *qua* the petitioners are quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
