JITENDRA CHAUHAN, J.

This writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India has been filed for issuance of direction to the respondents to pay remaining outstanding amount to the petitioner alongwith interest @ 18% per annum, which is due towards the respondents after completion of the entire work.

Learned counsel for respondent Nos. 2 to 7 informs that all the bills raised by the petitioner, wherein GST challan forms were filed, have already been released. He further informs that the work has been completed against which, the completion certificate also stands issued. The payment could not be released to the petitioner as the petitioner did not submit the

GST bills.

At this stage, learned counsel for respondent Nos. 2 to 7 informs that some of the work still requires to be completed.

Heard.

Without adverting to the merits of the case, the respondent-Corporation is directed to release the entire payment, wherein the completion certificate has been issued to the petitioner. The petitioner undertakes to clear GST liability within eight weeks from the receipt of the amount by him. The respondent -Corporation shall also pay interest at the rate of 6.5% per annum on the delayed payment from the date of issuance of the completion certificate within three months.

Disposed of accordingly.
