Learned counsel for the respondents, on the basis of the averments made in the written statement, informs this Court that almost all the benefits, for which the petitioner is entitled, after taking into account the daily wage service, which the petitioner had rendered from 19.03.1977 to 31.01.1980 as qualifying service, have already been released to the petitioner and the remaining benefits including the grant of interest on the said payments, will be released within a period of three months.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that keeping in view the statement made by learned counsel for the respondents, petitioner does not want to press this writ petition any further. He, however, prays for a liberty to approach the respondents by filing appropriate representation in case, any of the calculation, which has been done by the respondents while releasing the pensionary benefits, according to the petitioner, is not correct.

Learned counsel for the respondents, on the instructions from Mr. T.P.S. Phoolka, IAS, Deputy Commissioner, Barnala, submits that in case, any representation is filed, the same will also be taken into

consideration while releasing the pensionary benefits of the petitioner.

In view of the above, the present writ petition is disposed of
having been not pressed.
