Petitioner has filed this petition under Section 438 Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.77 dated 10.12.2018, under Section 306 IPC, 1860, registered at Police Station City Ahmedgarh, Tehsil, District Sangrur. The petitioner apprehended his arrest at the hands of Police.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has invited the attention of the Court to the order dated 29.08.2019 whereby while issuing notice of motion to the respondent-State, the interim protection was extended to the petitioner. The said order reads as under:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioner relies upon the compromise deed dated 28.01.2019 (Annexure P-3) and contends that CRM-M-7086-2019 is pending for quashing of the FIR on the basis of compromise.

Notice of motion for 03.12.2019.

Meanwhile, the petitioner shall join the investigation and would come present as and when

called for and in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be admitted to interim bail on his furnishing personal and surety bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. The petitioner shall also abide by the conditions as specified under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

To be heard with CRM-M-7086-2019.”

Learned counsel for the petitioner further contends that in deference to the said order, the petitioner submitted himself before the Police and joined the investigation. According to him, the petitioner cooperated with the Police Authorities during the investigation and furnished requisite bonds to the satisfaction of the Investigating Officer/Arresting Officer.

Learned State counsel who is assisted by ASI Kewal Singh does not dispute this fact that the petitioner has joined the investigation. Learned counsel on instructions from ASI Kewal Singh further states that the petitioner is not required for custodial interrogation for the time being.

Considering above, the petition is allowed and the interim bail granted by this Court vide order dated 29.08.2019 is made absolute.
