Based on two suicide notes i.e Annexures P-2 and P-3, the FIR in question bearing No.41 dated 13.04.2019 (Annexure P-1) was registered for the offence punishable under Section 306 read with Section 34 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 against four accused persons who are Doctors and Chartered Accountant.

Both the suicide notes dated 13.04.2019 were allegedly left behind by victims, namely, Jasvir Kaur and her son Krishan. Upon apprehension of arrest, the accused persons applied for grant of pre-arrest bail before the Additional Sessions Judge, Fatehgarh Sahib through four different applications which was decided collectively on 06.05.2019 and the concession of pre-arrest bail was extended.

This petition has been filed on 28.08.2019 for cancellation of the bail on the ground that the accused persons are hampering the

investigation. In respect of this ground, it is contended by learned counsel for the complainant (brother of Jasvir Kaur) that the suicide notes have not been sent for comparison of the signatures. It is not disputed that the investigation is pending and accused persons have joined the investigation.

After hearing learned counsel for the petitioner and perusing the suicide notes, this Court does not find any valid reason to exercise the jurisdiction under Section 439(2) Cr.P.C as there is no convincing ground made out by the petitioner regarding misuse of the concession.

Resultantly, petition is dismissed.
