This appeal has arisen from the judgement and decree dated 13.05.2016 passed by the District Judge (Family Court), Ambala by which a petition under Section 13 of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 (for short 'the Act') filed by the respondent-husband for dissolution of his marriage has been allowed on the ground of cruelty.

During the pendency of this appeal, efforts were made to explore the possibilities of a compromise between the parties. Ultimately, the parties have reached to an oral agreement to settle their dispute with regard to their marriage by parting ways on payment of ₹ 20,00,000/- towards full and final settlement, to be given by the respondent-husband to appellant-wife.

Accordingly, respondent-husband has handed over two drafts amounting to ₹8,00,000/- each, totalling ₹16,00,000/-, drawn in the name of the appellant-wife alongwith ₹4,00,000/- in cash to the appellant-wife in the Court. Learned counsel for the appellant-wife has shown her satisfaction

about the mode of payment and has submitted that the appellant-wife has no grouse left in pursuing the present appeal. It is also submitted by her that in view of the oral settlement arrived at between the parties, she wanted to withdraw the present appeal.

At this stage, learned counsel for the respondent-husband has submitted that there is another litigation pending between the parties before this Court i.e. **CRR-(F)-252-2016** titled as **Daljeet Kaur** Vs. **Harmeet Singh** which is fixed for hearing for 21.01.2019 and as per the oral agreement between the parties, the appellant-wife would withdraw that case also.

Learned counsel for the appellant-wife has assured this Court the aforesaid case shall also be withdrawn on the date fixed.

In view of the aforesaid facts and circumstances and on the request made by the appellant-wife, the present appeal is hereby dismissed as withdrawn.
