MANOJ BAJAJ, J.

Petitioner has filed this petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C with a prayer for issuance of directions to the official respondents to look into the representation Annexure P-2 and to inquire the same.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that on the strength of General Power of Attorney allegedly executed in the year 1996 by Bhupinder Singh (now deceased) who is husband of the petitioner, the attorney holder-respondent No.5 exceeded the authority and executed four different sale deeds spreading in between a period w.e.f.1997 to March 2013.

It is pointed out that the said Bhupinder Singh died on 05.08.2014 and there was no challenge to those sale deeds during his life time.

Neither the General Power of Attorney has been placed on record nor any sale deed is appended with the petition. Even the representation does not contain the requisite particulars of all these

instruments and the representation (Annexure P-2) is given five years after the death of Bhupinder Singh. The contents of the petition do not inspire any confidence.

Resultantly, no case is made out for invoking inherent powers under Section 482 Cr.P.C.

Petition is dismissed.
