Petitioner appears in person. He is aggrieved by the inaction of the respondents in declaring the result of the DPC, which took place on 30.05.2019. The petitioner points out that in normal course, DPC has declared the result between two to four weeks. The petitioner has also drawn my attention to Para 16.5.1 of the Government of India's instructions dated 10.04.1989 which envisage that the Departmental Promotion Committee proceedings should ordinarily be finalized within three months. He further points out that the said policy of Govt. of India has duly adopted by the Government of Punjab as is reflected from circular/letter dated 21.11.1995 (Annexure P-7) issued by the Department of Personnel and Administrative Reforms, Government of Punjab. The petitioner also caused issuance of a representation dated 13.08.2019 (Annexure P-5), but the same has not been adverted to till date by the respondents.

2. Notice of motion.

3. On advance service of copy of the petition, Ms. Ambika Bedi, Assistant Advocate General, Punjab, appears on behalf of respondents.

4. Given the nature of order being passed, there is no necessity to seek return by any of the respondents as no further proceedings and/or

pleadings are required.

5. Without commenting on the merits of case, writ petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondents to objectively consider the representation dated 13.08.2019 (Annexure P-5) and take a decision in accordance with the result of the DPC expeditiously, preferably within a period of six weeks and pass a speaking order, in accordance with law.
6. Disposed of in above terms.
