ANUPINDER SINGH GREWAL, J. (ORAL)

The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.158 dated 08.07.2019, under Sections 323, 324, 336, 148 and 149 IPC (Section 307 IPC added later on) and Sections 25 and 27 of the Arms Act, registered at Police Station Beas, Amritsar Rural, District Amritsar.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the injury which is attributed to the petitioner is on the left leg of the complainant and has been found to be simple in nature. He also contends that the petitioner is a farm labourer and he himself had received two injuries in the incident. He has referred to the medico legal report of the petitioner which is annexed at Annexure P-2. The petitioner is 22 years of age and is not involved in any other case.

This Court, by the order dated 07.11.2019, had directed the petitioner to appear before the Investigating Officer and join the investigation and in the event of his arrest, he was to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, upon instructions from ASI Charanjit Singh, states that although the petitioner has appeared before the Investigating Officer but other accused are yet to be arrested. He further states that injuries No.7 and 8 are attributed to the petitioner which have been found as grievous in nature which is controverted by the learned counsel for the petitioner, who states that the petitioner was allegedly carrying a rod while other co-accused were armed with spear and they would be caused by them being punctured wounds.

In view of the submissions of the learned counsel for the petitioner and the petitioner having joined investigation, the order dated 07.11.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. He shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
