ARUN MONGA, J.(ORAL)

Learned State counsel submits that no interim orders are warranted in the present case as prayed by the petitioner. She submits that if the claim of the petitioner is accepted, she is not entitled to be appointed as per her merit as the last selected candidate in Scheduled Caste category has secured 48 marks as against 40 marks secured by the petitioner.

2. In the premise, I am of the view that not only there is no case for interim protection, even otherwise, writ petition is devoid of merit, assuming that the petitioner was to be given the advantage of being considered in reserved category of either nature i.e. SC (M&B) and SC (R&O), either way, petitioner has lesser marks than the last selected candidate in both the category.

3. Petition is, accordingly, dismissed.
