Learned counsel for respondent No.3 states that during the pendency of the instant petition, entire payments have been made to the petitioner. The charge of payments made by respondent No.3 has also been handed over to learned counsel for the petitioner.

In this view of the matter, the instant petition is dismissed as having been rendered infructuous.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner states that no amount has been paid towards interest on the delayed payments.

As the principal relief has been allowed to the petitioner, he is free to move a representation to the competent authority with regard to interest within two months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order. On receipt of such representation, the competent authority shall

consider and decide the same as per law, within four weeks thereafter.
