Learned counsel for the appellant states that the appellant has suffered serious injuries, which resulted disability to the extent of 15% but a meagre amount of Rs.15,000/- has been awarded by the learned MACT under the head of 'pain and sufferings'. The contention is that no amount of has been awarded under the head of 'hospitalization', 'conveyance' and 'special diet'. He further contends that though the enhancement comes to more than ₹80,000/- but the appellant would be satisfied if another sum of ₹60,000/- more, over and above, the amount already awarded by the MACT concerned, is granted to the appellant in full and final satisfaction of the claim in the present appeal and in that eventuality the appellants would give up his claim regarding interest on the enhanced amount from the date of filing of the petition before the MACT, which is 20.12.2013 for about 9 years.

To us, this offer seems to be just, reasonable and equitable in the facts and circumstances of the case. Learned counsel for the respondent-Insurance Company prays for time to get concurrence from the concerned authority.
