Pursuant to the order dated 17.09.2019, a report from the learned Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Ludhiana, dated 04.11.2019, has been received. It is stated therein that the statement of respondent No.2 – Deepak Beri (i.e. the complainant in the FIR), was recorded on 09.10.2019, to the effect that the matter has been compromised between him and the petitioner, with the statements of respondent No.3 and of the petitioner also recorded to a similar effect.

As per the assessment of the learned Magistrate, the compromise has been entered into of the own free will of the parties.

That being so and the matter essentially stated to be a matrimonial dispute, with the petitioner and respondent No.3 being husband and wife, the petition is allowed and FIR No.62 dated 14.03.2017, registered for the alleged commission of offences punishable under Sections 406, 420, 506 IPC, at Police Station Division No.6, Industrial Area, Ludhiana City, and all subsequently proceedings emanating therefrom, is quashed.
