This is the second petition for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in NCB Crime No. 38 of 2018, dated 14.09.2018, under Sections 8, 15, 25, 27-A, 29 and 60 of the NDPS Act, 1985, registered at Police Station NCB Chandigarh.

Learned counsel for the petitioner, at the very outset, submits that he does not press the present petition on merits and prays that since only four prosecution witnesses have been examined so far, a direction may be issued to the trial Court to conclude the trial expeditiously.

The aforesaid prayer of learned counsel for the petitioner is not objected to by learned counsel for the Union of India.

In view of above limited prayer, this petition is disposed of with a direction to the trial court to conclude the trial expeditiously, preferably within a period of six months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.
