ANUPINDER SINGH GREWAL, J (ORAL)

The petitioners are seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.37 dated 02.06.2019, under Sections 323, 324, 148 and 149 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 ('IPC' - for short) (Section 326 IPC added later on), registered at Police Station Qila Lal Singh, District Batala.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that petitioner No.1 is alleged to have given 'dang' blows on the left arm and left side of the back of the complainant which were found to be simple in nature. He also contends that petitioner No. 2 is alleged to have raised 'lalkara' and no injury is attributed to her. He further contends that the injury for which offence under Section 326 IPC has been invoked is attributed to accused Jinderpal Singh, who is the son of the petitioners.

This Court, by the order dated 24.09.2019, had directed the petitioners to appear before the Investigating Officer and join the investigation and in the event of their arrest, they were ordered to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from SI Harjinder Singh, states that the petitioners have joined investigation and are not required for custodial interrogation.

In view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioners and the petitioners having joined investigation, the order dated 24.09.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioners is made absolute.

However, the petitioners shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. They shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
