As per pleadings on record, petitioner after passing 10+2 examination from Punjab School Education Board, took admission in the B.Com, three years course (six semesters) in the session commencing from 2016 in a college affiliated to Panjab University, Chandigarh. Petitioner is stated to have cleared all the subjects in B.Com Ist and 2nd semesters and even the Detailed Marks Cards have been issued by the Panjab University, Chandigarh. Thereafter, petitioner migrated from Panjab University, Chandigarh to Punjabi University, Patiala for the remaining four semesters of the B.Com course for the session 2017 onwards. Petitioner is stated to have cleared the 3rd , 4th and 5th semesters of the B.Com course in Punjabi University, Patiala. Even the Detailed Marks cards were duly issued to him. He thereafter appeared in the 6th Semester examination held in April/May 2019.

Placed on record Annexure P-3 is a Provisional Information Report from Punjabi University, Patiala, which apparently reflects the petitioner to have even passed the 6th Semester examination.

Prayer in the instant writ petition is for issuance of mandamus for directing the respondent-Punjabi University, Patiala to issue to him the Detailed Marks Certificate of B.Com Final six semesters examination.

It is the contention raised by learned counsel that six semesters' DMC is being withheld without any justifiable basis.

In view of the short grievance raised in the instant petition and without even ascertaining the correctness of the averments made in the petition, I deem it appropriate to dispose of the writ petition at the very threshold with a direction to respondent No.1-Registrar, Punjabi University, Patiala to examine the claim/grievance of the petitioner against the backdrop of legal notice dated 29.08.2019 (Annexure P-5). In case, the petitioner has qualified the 6th Semester examination and if there being no legal impediment, the necessary Detailed Marks Certificate be issued to the petitioner or otherwise the reasons for not issuing the Detailed Marks Certificate be conveyed to him.

The directions issued by this Court be complied with expeditiously and in any case within a period of two weeks from today.
