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MAHABIR SINGH SINDHU, J.

Present petition has been filed under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 (for short 'Cr.P.C.') for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners, in FIR No.1013 dated 22.11.2018, under Sections 420, 406, 467, 468, 471, 201, 120-B of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (for short 'IPC'), and Section 3 of Haryana Protection of Depositors in FE Act, 2013, registered at Police Station City Ballabgarh, District Faridabad.

On 27.09.2019, this Court has passed the following order:-

“Inter-alia contends that the matter has since been compromised between the parties vide compromise deed dated 16.08.2019 (Annexure P-3).

Adjourned to 16.10.2019.

In the meantime, the petitioners are directed to join the investigation and appear before the

investigating agency. In the event of their arrest, they shall be admitted to interim bail on their furnishing bail bonds to the satisfaction of the Arresting/ Investigating Officer. The petitioner shall abide by the terms and conditions as envisaged in Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.”

Learned State counsel, on instructions from police official, has stated that in terms of order dated 27.09.2019, petitioners have joined investigation and their custodial interrogation is not required.

In view of the above, order dated 27.09.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioners, is made absolute, subject to the provisions of Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Petition stands disposed off, accordingly.

However, it is made clear that the petitioners shall fully co-operate with the Investigating Officer as and when called for further investigation.

The above observations may not be construed as an expression of opinion on the merits of the case.
