This appeal has arisen from the judgement and decree dated 19.05.2018 passed by the Additional District and Sessions Judge, Amritsar by which a petition under Section 13 of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 (for short 'the Act'), filed by the respondent-husband for grant of decree of divorce on the ground of cruelty has been allowed.

In brief, marriage of the parties was solemnized on 26.11.2007 as per Sikh Rites at Amritsar. They were blessed with a female child, namely; Reet who is at present 10 years of age.

We have interacted with both the parties and their daughter Reet in our chamber. The appellant-wife has submitted that she is ready and willing to withdraw the present appeal and has no objection if their daughter-Reet is kept in the permanent custody of the respondent with a condition that she may be allowed to visit the child without any interference by him.

Mr. Amandeep Singh, respondent-husband is candid enough to contend that he would never stop the appellant from meeting their child and

further submitted that he would also take good care of her daughter. It is also submitted by him that they would also evolve some mechanism as per which their child-Reet may have the love and affection of both the parents inasmuch as she may also spend atleast a week with her mother during her vacations.

In view of the aforementioned facts and circumstances, the present appeal is hereby disposed of as having been not pressed.
