The issue raised in this petition was of claiming grace marks on account of certain questions that were set out in the question paper for Teachers Eligibility Test and which, according to the appellant, were not having correct answers.

The learned Single Judge went into the issue and partly accepted the grievance of the appellant as also other similarly situated persons and granted certain marks wherever there was discrepancy. The appellant is dissatisfied with the order of the learned Single Judge and claims that other questions be also evaluated similarly and benefit be granted to him.

On a perusal of the impugned judgment, we notice that the correction and benefit of marks was given after the experts had examined the matter, in particular the questions which were referred to them. We are thus of the opinion that the learned Single Judge's approach cannot be faulted with, and once the experts had opined to the effect noticed by the learned Single Judge, there would be no reason to take a contrary view as the opinion of the experts has to be given primacy.

No ground to interfere particularly when the appeal is barred by

a delay of 25 days in filing and 167 days in re-filing.

Dismissed.
