Even though the FIR in question is of the year 2014, it having been seen from the order of the learned trial court that the petitioner was appearing before that court till July 26, 2018, after which on 04.08.2018 he had sought exemption from personal appearance before the trial court, which was granted to him on that date itself, but thereafter he was not appearing before that court despite notices/warrants having been issued to secure his presence, I see no ground to entertain this petition.

That being so, without making any comment on the actual merits of the case, for or against the petitioner, this petition is dismissed.

Naturally, upon the petitioner surrendering before the trial court and, in the event of his arrest, filing a petition under the provisions of Section 439 of the Cr.P.C., that petition would be decided by the trial court wholly on its own merits as expeditiously as possible.
