Prayer in this petition is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in FIR No.66 dated 29.05.2019 registered under Sections 323, 324, 307, 427, 148, 149 of the Indian Penal Code (in short 'IPC') at Police Station Nurpur Bedi, District Roopnagar.

Counsel for the petitioner has submitted that as per the allegations in the FIR, registered at the instance of Neeraj Kumar, he along with his father and his father's elder uncle's son namely Dharampal and his elder brother – Rohit Kumar had gone to attend the Panchayat and had parked their vehicle in front of Janj Ghar and when they were returning, two vehicles, one Scorpio car and one Brezza intercepted them and 15-16 persons get off from the same and they were holding kirpan, gandasi, kirch and dandas in their hands. Immediately, they attacked the complainant party. The petitioner – Lakhvir Singh @ Lucky was holding a kirpan and gave a blow of the same on the head of the complainant with an intention to kill him. The other accused persons also gave injuries to other victims as stated in the FIR.

Counsel for the petitioner has further submitted that the injury was, however, declared dangerous to life and therefore, the petitioner is entitled to concession of anticipatory bail.

Mr. Amitabh Tewari, Advocate has put in appearance on behalf of the complainant (at his own) and opposed the prayer for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner on the ground that the accused persons in conspiracy with each other have caused multiple injuries to the victims.

After hearing the counsel for the parties, considering the serious allegations levelled against the petitioner that he was armed with a kirpan and with intention to kill the complainant, he has given blow on the left side of the head of the complainant. As per the MLR, there are 12 injuries sustained by the complainant which shows that the accused persons have given merciless beatings to the complainant party, therefore, I find no ground to grant the relief of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Dismissed.
