 This Letters Patent Appeal is directed against the judgment of
the learned Single Judge dated 16.5.2017.

 While disposing of the writ petition, the learned Single Judge
noticed that the cut off date for the first professional session of BUMS was
30.11.2016 by which time the institute had admitted 40 out of 50 students
while 10 were reserved for students who have done their pre-Tib course and
noticing that substantial portion of the course had commenced, declined
admission to 10 students, while admission of the remaining 40 students was
not disturbed.

 While dealing with the Letters Patent Appeal against the said
order this Court on 28.9.2017 directed that all 50 students who were

permitted to be admitted shall be permitted to appear in the examinations as well on provisional basis.

It has now been brought to our notice that the examinations were postponed to February which enabled the remaining students to undertake the complete course and consequently, after taking the examinations, the session has been concluded and all the students have marched on to their next semester.

If that be so, then we are of the opinion that cause espoused in the present appeal has been rendered illusory. Instant appeal is, therefore, disposed of and the admission of all the students for all intents and purposes shall be construed to be regular.
