Petitioner prays for pre-arrest bail in FIR No.242 dated 3.9.2018 registered under Section 302 IPC and Sections 27, 29, 54 of Arms Act at Police Station Sangrur.

Notice of motion.

On the asking of the Court, Mr. S.P.S.Tinna, Additional Advocate General, who is present in Court accepts notice on behalf of State of Punjab.

Mr. P.S.Ahluwalia, Advocate has put in appearance on behalf of first informant.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that police after carrying out investigation found the petitioner to be innocent and was got released under the orders of Chief Judicial Magistrate. He further submits that the petitioner has been now summoned under Section 193 Cr.P.C.

Learned counsel for the first informant submits that indulgence

should not be granted because the petitioner is an accused in a double murder case and he fled away to Australia in violation of the undertaking given and without seeking permission of the Court.

On the other hand, learned counsel for the petitioner points out that petitioner had gone to Australia after having been discharged by the competent Court of jurisdiction. He further submits that petitioner is ready to surrender and face trial, however, at this stage, custodial interrogation shall not be required.

In view of above, present petition is disposed of by directing the petitioner to surrender before the Trial Court within a period of 10 days from today and furnish bail and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the Trial Court, thereafter the Court shall release the petitioner on bail.
