The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.645 dated 07.08.2019, under Sections 379, 188, 120-B, 420, 467, 468 and 471 IPC, registered at Police Station Nuh, District Nuh.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the allegations in the FIR are that the truck, which is owned by the petitioner, was carrying stolen stones which were dug up through illegal mining. He, however, contends that the FIR is the result of the incident which had taken place on the previous night wherein the truck of the petitioner, which had unloaded marbles at a place at Nuh, was returning which was looted by 8-10 persons and the driver of the truck who had received bullet injuries, has lodged a complaint with the police in that regard.

This Court, by order dated 30.10.2019, had directed the petitioner to appear before the Investigating/Arresting Officer and join the investigation

and in the event of his arrest, he was to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, upon instructions from Head Constable Daya Singh, states that the petitioner has joined investigation and has produced a bill but the details mentioned therein have to be verified.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner shall keep appearing before the Investigating Officer as and when called by him and shall also render all possible cooperation.

In view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner and the petitioner having joined investigation, the order dated 30.10.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. He shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
