The petitioner seeks a direction to the passport authorities not to raise an objection upon his passport application in relation to the pending FIR No. 115 of 4.6.2005 on the file of Police Station Sadar Mansa, District Mansa registered against the petitioner under Section 39 of the Electricity Act, 2003 and Section 379 of the Indian Penal Code (Annexure P-1). Admittedly, the petitioner filed a fresh application for issuance of a passport and the basis for this apprehension is the objection raised by the authorities in relation to his earlier application made in the year 2017.

The writ petition is therefore motivated by mere apprehension and surmise. Unless the authorities deal with the application filed by the petitioner on its own merit, it cannot be predicted at this stage as to whether any objection would be raised in relation to the pending FIR.

The writ petition is therefore premature and is accordingly dismissed on this short ground.
