The petitioners seek a direction to the police authorities of the State of Haryana to protect them from respondent No.5, Sandeep. In the writ petition, it is alleged that respondent No.5 tried to kill the petitioners so as to get the property transferred in his name.

Be it noted that respondent No.5 is none other than the son of petitioner Nos.1 and 2. Though the pleadings are to the effect that an attempt was made by respondent No.5 to kill the petitioners, the complaint dated 17.09.2019 made by petitioner No.1 to the Superintendent of Police, Jind, is silent on this aspect. That apart, this Court finds that the said complaint is completely bereft of details and vaguely states that respondent No.5 is creating disputes and using abusive language, apart from beating the petitioners by forcibly entering into their house. No details are furnished as

to when these alleged beatings took place.

Mr. Saurabh Girdhar, learned Assistant Advocate General, State of Haryana, having received instructions from Sub Inspector Virender Singh, Police Station Alewa, Jind, would inform this Court that there is no evidence of any report having been submitted to the jurisdictional police authorities by any of the petitioners against respondent No.5.

Given this situation, this Court is of the opinion that the petitioners cannot complain of inaction on the part of the police authorities upon the vague complaint of petitioner No.1 dated 17.09.2019.

The writ petition is accordingly dismissed on this short ground leaving it open to the petitioners to make a full and detailed complaint, if and when the need arises. In the event such a complaint is made, the jurisdictional police authorities shall take appropriate action thereon in accordance with law.
