Prayer in this petition is for grant of anticipatory bail in FIR No.429 dated 18.09.2019 under Sections 406, 420 IPC, registered at Police Station Sadar Thanesar, District Kurukshetra.

While granting interim bail to the petitioner, following order was passed by this Court on 30.10.2019: -

“...Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that as per allegations in the FIR, registered against five persons i.e. Anil Kumar son of petitioner Sultan Singh, petitioner Sultan Singh and three other persons namely Amarjit, Ashwani and Kumar Prince, who are residents of Delhi, it is stated that on asking of the one Lal Singh, milkman, complainant approached the petitioner and his son and thereafter, son of the petitioner Anil Kumar took Lal Singh, complainant and one ASI Pargat Singh to Delhi, where they

met accused No.3 to 5 for sending their sons abroad. It is further submitted that a written agreement was executed between the complainant side and other accused persons and relies upon one of such agreement (Annexure P-2), which is signed by Amarjit, Kumar Prince, Ashwani and Anil Kumar on 08.02.2019 in this regard. It is next submitted that the petitioner, who is an agriculturist, aged about 66 years, is an ordinary person being father of co-accused Anil Kumar, against whom there are allegations. Learned counsel further submits that son of the petitioner will surrender before the Investigating Officer within a period of three days from today... ”

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that in pursuance of the aforesaid order, petitioner has joined the investigation and is not required for any further investigation. It is further submitted that son of the petitioner namely Anil Kumar has already surrendered before the police and is in judicial custody.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from SI Surender Singh, has not disputed the factual position and states that the petitioner is no more required for any further investigation.

In view of the above, this petition is allowed and the interim bail granted to the petitioner vide order dated 30.10.2019 is made absolute subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.
