On 23.10.2019, the following order had been recorded:

“ Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that as per the complainant, as recorded in the FIR, it is stated as follows:-

“Signature of Manpreet Singh has been obtained on the alleged marriage certificate by practicing a fraud upon him.”

Notice of motion be issued to the respondent, returnable on 14.11.2019.

In the meanwhile, upon the petitioner joining investigation, in case he is sought to be arrested, he would be admitted to interim bail, till the next date of hearing only, on his furnishing adequate bail and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the arresting officer/Illaqa Magistrate. He shall abide by the conditions stipulated in Section 438(2) of the Cr.P.C.

If the arresting officer does not join the petitioner in investigation, he would appear before the learned Illaqa Magistrate immediately, who would then summon the arresting officer and direct him to join him in investigation.”

Today, learned State counsel submits that as a matter of fact, the signatures of the petitioner on the “marriage certificate” could not have been fraudulently obtained, he being an educated person with an ITI

diploma.

Nevertheless, since the complainant's grievance is obviously not against the petitioner, as per the FIR, it is considered appropriate that without making any comments on the actual merits of the case for or against the petitioner, the order dated 23.10.2019 is made absolute.

Ordered accordingly.

Petition is accordingly disposed of.
