On October 24, 2019, the following order had been passed:-

“Though the petitioner admittedly did not even seek permission of the Court before travelling to Australia while she was on bail, however, Mr. Manchanda points to Annexure P-9, which is shown to be a document issued by a hospital in Australia where she is shown to have been undergoing dialysis, with there also being some other complications pertaining to Rheumatology.

Notice of motion be issued to the respondent, returnable on 21.11.2019.

In view of the above, the petitioner upon appearing before the trial Court and depositing her passport with that Court, shall be admitted to interim bail to the satisfaction of that Court, till the next date of hearing before this Court.”

Today learned State counsel, on instructions from the police official who is present in court to assist him, submits that pursuant to the aforesaid order of this court, the petitioner has surrendered before the trial court, but with the learned counsel for the complainant submitting that the petitioner having indulged in human trafficking in Australia (as contended), she does not deserve the concession of bail.

Having considered the matter, since the petitioner at this stage is shown to have undergone dialysis in Australia, without making any comment on the merits of the case, for or against the petitioner, subject to the petitioner continuing to appear before the trial court on each and every date that she is summoned to do so (unless exempted by that court itself), and her passport remaining surrendered, with her prohibited from leaving India, the interim order dated 24.10.2019 is made absolute, on the same terms and conditions.
