Petitioner Daljit Singh has filed this petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.217 dated 06.11.2018, registered at Police Station Sadar Nakodar, District Jalandhar (Rural), under Sections 307, 323, 324, 506, 148 and 149 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860.

The FIR was registered on the statement of complainant Sunny Kumar, wherein it is alleged that on 05.11.2018 at about 6:30 P.M., when he along with his brother had gone for a walk, in the meantime, from village Kang Sahboo side Daljit Singh along with accomplices, armed with kirpan, gandasi, base-ball bat, etc., came there on motor cycle and auto rickshaw. Ram Lal gave lalkara that he (complainant) be taught a lesson for causing injuries to his uncle Som Nath. Thereafter, all the accused caused injuries to complainant and his brother with their respective weapons. Daljit Singh armed with kirpan and gave injuries to the brother of the complainant. On raising alarm, all of them fled away from the spot.

The petitioner is specifically named in the FIR, who was armed with kirpan and had caused injuries to the brother of the complainant. The

offence is punishable under Section 307 IPC.

Considering the nature of the offence, this Court does not find any valid reason to extend any extraordinary concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

The petition is dismissed.
