ANUPINDER SINGH GREWAL, J (ORAL)

The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.91 dated 02.09.2019, under Sections 307, 323, 427, 34 IPC and Section 61 of the Punjab Excise Act, 1914, registered at Police Station Division No.2, Pathankot, District Pathankot.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the allegations in the FIR against the petitioner are that 175 cartons of Indian made foreign liquor were recovered from the canter in which two people were travelling and both of them were arrested at the spot. It is alleged that the car which was following the canter was asked to stop and the occupants sped away after hitting the motor cycle of the police officials. Learned counsel also contends that the petitioner has been arraigned as an accused as he is the owner of the canter. Learned counsel also contends that the canter had been rented out to the co-accused namely Ajit Singh. The petitioner is 25 years of age and he is not

involved in any other case. He also contends that the co-accused namely Sahil Mehra has been granted anticipatory bail by this Court by the order dated 27.09.2019.

This Court, by the order dated 24.10.2019, had directed the petitioner to appear before the Investigating Officer and join the investigation and in the event of his arrest, he was ordered to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, upon instructions from ASI Harpreet Singh, states that the petitioner has joined investigation and is not required for custodial interrogation.

In view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner and the petitioner having joined investigation, the order dated 24.10.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. He shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
