The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.0002, dated 01.01.2019, under Section 22 of the NDPS Act, registered at Police Station Division No.1, District Police Commissionerate, Jalandhar.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the allegations against the petitioner are that 9 injections each containing 2ml Buprenorphine were recovered which is below the threshold of commercial quantity. He further contends that the petitioner had earlier been granted regular bail by the trial Court as he could not appear before the trial Court on one date as he had wrongly noted the date. Consequently, his bail was cancelled. He undertakes that the petitioner shall henceforth appear before the Court on each and every date of hearing and would not absent himself except with the prior permission of the Court. He also contends that the petitioner is not involved in any other case under the NDPS Act.

This Court, by the order dated 07.11.2019, had directed the petitioner to appear before the trial Court and on his doing so, he was to be released on ad interim bail subject to the satisfaction of the trial court.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that in term of order dated 7.11.2019, the petitioner appeared before the trial court and has been released on interim bail.

In view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner and the petitioner having appeared before the trial court, the order dated 07.11.2019 granting ad interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.

The petition stands disposed of.
