Prayer in this petition is for grant of anticipatory bail in FIR No.106 dated 26.04.2019 under Sections 379-B, 511, 34 IPC, registered at Police Station City Sri Muktsar Sahib.

While granting interim bail to the petitioner, following order was passed by this Court on 07.11.2019: -

“Learned counsel for the petitioner relies upon the order dated 29.08.2019, vide which co-accused Navkiran Singh was granted the concession of interim anticipatory bail, by passing the following order: -

“Counsel for the petitioner has submitted that there is a delay of 03 days in registration of the FIR and as per the allegations in the FIR, after the incident has occurred in

which 04 persons tried to loot Rs.80,000/- from the petitioner, he was searched them at his own and then came to know that the names of the accused are Navkiran named as Gullu in the FIR, Dalbir @ Dulla, Gopi and Paramjit Singh. It is further submitted that even as per the allegations, the aforesaid 04 persons had left one motorcycle at the spot but the petitioner approached the police after a period of 03 days by making a story.

Notice of motion for 17.09.2019.”

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the aforesaid order has been made absolute on 17.09.2019.”

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that in pursuance of the aforesaid order, the petitioner has joined the investigation and is not required for any further investigation.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from HC Balwant Singh, has not disputed the factual position and states that the petitioner is no more required for any further investigation.

In view of the above, this petition is allowed and the interim bail granted to the petitioner vide order dated 07.11.2019 is made absolute subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.
