The present petition has been filed under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in FIR No.0052 dated 16.05.2018, under Sections 307, 506, 34 of the Indian Penal Code and Sections 25 and 27 of the Arms Act, 1959, registered at Police Station Mamdot, District Ferozepur.

On 18.01.2019, the following order was passed by this Court:

“Complainant-Paramjit Singh and injured-Sewa Singh are present in the Court and identified by I.O/ASI Shingara Singh.

Learned Counsel for the petitioner states that the matter has been compromised between the parties.

Although, this Court will not opine about the legality and validity of the compromise, entered into between the parties, but since the matter has been settled, the petitioner is directed to join the investigation before the Investigating Officer. In the event of his arrest, the Arresting Officer would admit him to interim bail till the next date of hearing in the present case on his furnishing adequate bail and surety bonds to his satisfaction. The petitioner is also directed to abide by all the conditions as

envisaged under Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.

On request of learned State Counsel, adjourned to
20.02.2019 for further consideration”

It is contended by learned counsel for the petitioner that in terms of the order dated 18.01.2019, the petitioner has joined the investigation.

On instructions from HC Kulwant Singh, the above factual position is duly acknowledged by learned State counsel and stated that the custodial interrogation of the petitioner is no longer required in the present case.

In view of the above, the order dated 18.01.2019 is made absolute subject to the provisions of Section 438(2) Cr. P.C.

Petition stands disposed off.
